Linda R. is an enthusiastic and passionate resident of the Center of Family Love, who was born and raised in Lexington, Oklahoma. Following her formative years in school, she attended a VoTech to hone her skills in Food Service. Here, Linda found something that she had been lacking--her love for cooking and baking. This started with a middle school project to make scrambled eggs with cheese; since then she has not looked back! She particularly enjoys cake decorating and cookie decorating, which she indulged in heavily after moving to CFL in March 2021. On top of this, Linda has been able to work closely with the chef at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club for the Center of Family Love Grand Dinner held in Fall 2022.



Tanner B. RESIDENT Tanner B. is a resident of Center of Family Love from Seiling, Oklahoma who has faced more adversity in his short life than most will ever experience. At just 13-years-old he was injured in a serious car accident with his brother on a slippery road, and at 15 he was diagnosed with a brain tumor. Fortunately, with the care of Children's Hospital in Bethany, OK, he was taken to remission and made the most out of his childhood, even meeting Bob Stoops, The University of Oklahoma Football Head Coach, where Coach Stoops gave him an autographed football that now hangs proudly on his wall. Rather than become disheartened by this dark start to life, Tanner's bright future vision remains steadfastly intact and alive. He dreams of becoming a researcher in proton radiation and works towards perfecting the craft every single day. His basic rights to independence have been granted at CFL, enabling him to pay bills and complete tasks on his own terms, something which has further buttressed his confidence. This inspiring go-getter is even experienced as an emcee for CFL events, showing off both his vibrant character and unwavering determination. Despite having already endured such seemingly insurmountable odds from two brain tumors, Tanner B. plans for an even brighter path ahead filled with compassion, progressive work ethic, wise decision making, tireless thrill-seeking spirit - all while giving back through volunteerism at the same Children's Hospital that helped save him so many years ago.



Natalie S. RESIDENT

Natalie S. is an optimistic soul who was born and raised in the small town of Kingfisher, Oklahoma. She had a knack for learning from a young age, often achieving honors at school, and she took this aptitude to VoTech during her last two years of high school where she studied Health Sciences. In 1998, Natalie ventured outside her home and began working at the Center of Family Love with their vocational program. Ever since then, she has been the welcoming face behind the front desk of Filters for Life production facility's reception area. Natalie loves to be professionally dressed as she greets customers and visitors while answering phone calls and taking filter orders. Her infectious smile radiates positivity in everything that she does and her message to the world is loud and clear: keep looking forward with faith and gratitude, no matter what life throws your way.

Debbie Espinosa PRESIDENT AND CEO OF CENTER OF FAMILY LOVE AND EXECUTIVE PRODUCER OF PEOPLE LIKE US

Debbie Espinosa has served in numerous leadership positions throughout her career, including the Executive Director for Deaconess Hospital's Health & Wellness Center and then Executive Director of Deaconess Pregnancy & Adoption Services, where she expanded the agency by doubling the number of clients served, and tripling the number of successful adoptions during her first year. She served as CEO of New York Operations for The Olive Branch/One Accord Initiatives, Inc., a nonprofit organization helping chemically dependent women with children to be free from drug addiction. Later she served as the Administrator at Integris Medical Center, leading their Home Health Agency from a failing business entity to become a profitable agency with over one million dollars in net revenue each year. The home health agency was ranked 25th in the nation.

Debbie's greatest passion and joy has been serving for 11 years as the President and CEO at the Center of Family Love, a long-term residential care facility serving 130 adults with physical and developmental disabilities. These residents remain under the care of the Center of Family Love, free of charge, for their lifetime. The Center of Family Love's purpose is to celebrate the value and dignity of every human life and ensure that those with disabilities can discover their talents as they reach for and achieve their dreams. During Debbie's tenure, CFL has raised over 34 million dollars, which has enabled the organization to expand its vision, programs, and services.

Today Debbie's vision is an expansion of services with the launch of a second campus, building a new platform for their residents. This future includes expanding the Center of Family Love to serve more individuals with disabilities and learning differences. The Center's newest initiative is to launch a capital campaign to raise \$40 million to build the Oklahoma Institute for Cognitive Development. This 70,000 square foot training and education facility will enable CFL to serve an additional 500 individuals with developmental disabilities through programming services. These future students will receive professional training that is matched with their inherent abilities to create a new workforce of gifted culinary artists, computer technology assistants, veterinary technicians, and other specialists.

Debbie has received numerous awards and accolades, including, "2019 Person of the Year" award from the Notre Dame Club of Oklahoma City, "Transformational Leader in Aging Services Award" from LeadingAge Oklahoma, and the "2023 Chief Justice Kane Civic Award" by Chief Justice Kane Assembly 848 4th Degree Knights of Columbus. She was also chosen in 2023 as "Woman of Influence" by LUXIERE Magazine.

Debbie Espinosa is a lifelong resident of Oklahoma City. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Oklahoma University. She is a Licensed Nursing Home Administrator and Licensed Home Health Administrator. She and her husband Sid have three children and seven grandchildren.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Can you provide more details about the Center of Family Love and their mission to challenge the world's marginalization of those with intellectual and developmental disabilities?

These sobering figures highlight the immense barriers faced by those with IDD in society.


How can individuals and organizations get involved with the Center of Family Love?
